We do so in keeping with our commitment to our past, our commitment to our ancestors and our mission to remember – no matter what.

For those delegations who anticipate the ability to travel, we look forward to cooperating with you as you plan your journey as well as coordinating with you in regard to your participation in a March of the Living commemorative event during 2021.

Meanwhile, we will continue to meet the challenges of the day with online programming and educational digital outreach as we adjust to the new way of connecting, of teaching and of staying focused on our mission to combat antisemitism and hatred while using the lessons of the past as warnings for the future.

We trust that together we will continue to keep the flame of Holocaust memory and legacy alive through the mechanisms within our reach. Our mission is as important as ever, as the world is still aflame with antisemitism and intolerance. We are pleased and willing to participate and assist your efforts in any way we can.

And even though it seems so very far away, we invite you to join us in our creative preparations for an extraordinary 2022 March of the Living, when we hope to once again be able to gather together in Poland and Israel free of the threat of pandemic. With renewed invigoration, we look forward to continuing our age-old tradition on the ground, in person and en masse.
