In collaboration with NN Intercambios Education, the only AIRC certified educational agency in Latin America, the American Hebrew Academy is proud to announce that it has formed a strategic alliance with [Colegio Renascença](#) a leading Jewish day schools in Sao Paulo. The new alliance will provide greater opportunity to high school students seeking to study in the United States at the only international Jewish college prep boarding school in the world. The American Hebrew Academy (AHA) is an elite school with one of the most prestigious campuses in the world for Jewish high school education.

The American Hebrew Academy, a private school serving students ages 14-19 years of age was founded in 2001. It is nationally accredited by the Southern Association of Independent Schools and Colleges and a member of TABS, the Association of Boarding Schools. The Academy is presently ranked among the Top Ten Jewish schools in the United States; the Top Ten private schools in North Carolina, the number one private school in the triad metropolitan area and was most recently named among the top private schools of distinction in the United States by Newsweek magazine.
